Call anytime day or night and talk with a nurse. Describe your health problem and they will help you decide if you should see your primary care provider (PCP) or go to urgent care.

Video Visits

Video Visits provide access anytime to healthcare providers licensed in New Mexico. No need for an appointment. Talk with a provider day or night using your smartphone, tablet or computer webcam. For more information on Video Visits, log in to myPRES.

Primary Care Providers & MyChart

Your PCP is the right person to see first for most health problems. If your problem is serious, your PCP may want to see you the same day or tell you to go to urgent care.

MyChart is a secure, web-based portal that allows Presbyterian Medical Group patients to send electronic messages and communicate with their care team.

Urgent Care

Urgent care clinics are for times when you need care right away but it is not an emergency. Most are open evenings and weekends. An urgent care clinic can take less time than a trip to the hospital emergency room (ER). Visit phs.org for a list of urgent care locations and hours.

TOP REASONS TO TRY ONE OF THESE OPTIONS INSTEAD OF GOING TO THE ER:

- Fever and body aches
- Earache
- Cold or flu
- Pain/burning when using the bathroom
- Nausea or feeling generally ill
- Sore throat or cough
- Vomiting or diarrhea
- Mild injuries and cuts
- Rashes without fever

GO TO THE ER IF YOU HAVE A LIFE-THREATENING EMERGENCY LIKE:

- Chest pain
- Severe injury or possible broken bones
- Severe pain to any body part
- Bleeding that wont stop
- Extreme difficulty breathing
- Confusion, numbness and tingling, or if you suddenly can't use part of your body
- Strong feelings of wanting to hurt yourself
