



Socorro General Hospital Report to the Community 2015



Socorro General Hospital is a not-for-profit hospital that has been managed by Presbyterian Healthcare Services since 1976. The hospital provides comprehensive inpatient and outpatient healthcare to the residents of Socorro and Catron counties. Socorro General Hospital and Presbyterian Healthcare Services operate the hospital, seven clinics, and an on-site, full-service laboratory. Additional services include emergency medicine, community outreach programs, as well as primary and specialty care services. Socorro General Hospital is one of eight hospitals run by Presbyterian, which has a statewide health plan and a growing multi-specialty group.

Serving Our Community

In 2015:

- We employed more than 192 people and generated hundreds of additional jobs in the community.
- We provided more than \$15 million in employee salaries, wages, and benefits.
- Our 11 auxiliaries volunteered a total of 2,530 hours.
- We maintained an on-site, full-service laboratory.
- We offered free flu shot clinics.
- We provided more than \$7.4 million in community benefit (including financial assistance).
- We supported community health initiatives, including Run for Your Life, Relay for Life, Socorro Community Arts Programs, Alamo Health Fair, Socorro Family Fun Fest, and the Veguita Community Arts Party.
- We offered monthly Child Safety Seat classes, Circle of Security Parenting classes, Maze of Life for Socorro, Alamo, and Magdalena students.
- We also offered a home visitation program for new parents.
- The Socorro General Hospital Board of Trustees provided governance, leadership, and direction for Socorro General Hospital, our clinics, and emergency medical services.



Our Accomplishments

- Socorro General Hospital engaged Stroudwater Associates through a grant provided by the Small Rural Hospital Transition project. The purpose was to position Socorro General Hospital for success in the rapidly evolving healthcare market.
- A recent survey by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services asked patients a series of questions. All the patients surveyed said they would recommend Socorro General Hospital, making it New Mexico's most recommended hospital.
- Recognized by iVantage Health Analytics and the National Organization of State Office of Rural Health for overall excellence in Outcomes, reflecting top quartile performance among all hospitals in the nation.
